176. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Resolved that comments, as under, be submitted to the Borough Council:-

(a) TVS 3387: Ground Floor Side Extension and Double Garage - The Cottage, Malthouse Farm, Lower Street, Braishfield: E. Lownes

No objection.

(b) TVS 3381: Outline - Erection of One Dwelling and Garage - Land Adjoining Chalkpit Cottage, Romsey Road, Braishfield: Mrs. M. E. Dance

The Parish Council is opposed to this proposed development on the grounds that the site is situated outside of the built up part of the village; and that the application, if approved, would set an undesirable precedent for similar sites in the Parish.

(c) TVS 3407: Ground Floor Side Extension - Pucknall Cottage.
Dores Lane, Braishfield: Mr. & Mrs. M. Ransome

No objection provided the style of the proposed new windows and door are in keeping with the character of the dwelling.

(d) TVS 2147/3: Outline - Agricultural Dwelling - Merrie Mead Farm, Braishfield: K. Emery

Whilst it appreciates the agricultural aspect of the proposed development, the Parish Council continues to be most concerned about the restricted access to this holding, particularly in the light of the declared intention to expand the activity. If, however, the application is approved, the Parish Council would wish the Local Planning Authority to impose a condition, or enter into a legal Agreement, requiring the removal from the site of the existing mobile home immediately upon the proposed new dwelling being first occupied.
