 Housing.


Miss Bacon reported that RSH had been

General A.L. Ransome was again elected Chairman and Mr. Cobbold Vice Chairman of the Council.

All the members of the Council have been regular attendants at the Meetings of the Council.

Again many matters have been considered by the Council and I will report on them as they arose.

Housing on the Post Office site was pressed for and after several plans had been discussed it was decided that three dwellings should be built on the Post Office Site and three on the Chapel site and these dwellings are now nearing completion. The older houses are to be modernised.

Parish Councils association. Mr. Parsons and Mr. Cobbold have attended Meetings of this Association as the Councils representatives.

Footpaths A Policy Statement was made by the County Council during the year and Mr. Newberry of the County Council attended one of the Councils Meetings and explained the Policy to the Council.

Roads Constant survey of the roads in the parish has been maintained and the Divisional Surveyor asked to do works on the Roads particularly Newport Lane and Kiln Lane and the Road from the Manor to Bowling Green. The work on this road has been dealt with and a great improvement has resulted. The Pond has been cleaned out to allow the water to drain away more quickly.

Recreation Ground. The hedge surrounding the Ground had been dealt with at a cost of £ 10 and this cost was offset by the receipt of £ 10 for the use of the Ground by the School from the Education authority. The entrance to the Ground has been improved.

Planning During the year application was made to use the field opposite the Wheatsheaf Inn for Housing and the Council opposed this application and a member of the Council attended the Enquiry and stated the Councils views.

Bus Shelter After six panes of glass in the Bus shelter had been broken the Council decided to remove the lights from the Shelter to save further expense.

World Refugee Year. The Council had been asked to help with this Appeal and it was agreed that the matter should be dealt with as a village. Miss Bacon on behalf of the Council undertook to call a Meeting of the organisations in the village with a view to a joint effort.

Rateable Value The Rateable Value of the Parish is £ 4,209 and the Product of a penny rate £ 17.
