and the members of the Parish Council and 70 from
the County Council and District Council Representatives
and a number of Parishioners.

of the Council and this was accepted.

Gen. A.L Ransome was again elected Chairman and Mr. Cobbold Vice Chairman of the Council.

All the emembers of the Council have been regular attendants at the Meetings of the Council except Mr. Willett who suffered from ill health and then in October resigned from the Council on leaving the District.

Parish Councils Association. Mr. Parsons and Mr. Cobbold have attendeded the Meetings of this Association as the Councils representatives.

District Council. Mr. Brown the District Council representative has been a regular attendant at the Councils Meetings and the Council is grateful for his help in many ways.

Bus Service. On representation the Bus Service has been improved.

Planning ~~xxx Roads~~. The Council had made its views known with regard to Planning applications.

Roads . Watch had been kept on the Roads in the Parish and many suggestions made to the Divisional Surveyor who has endeavoured to carry out improvements on the money and labour available.

Bus Shelter. Again this year damage has been caused and the Council agreed that the seats should be removed.

Recreation Ground. Again a payment of £ 10 had been received from the County Council for the use of the Ground by the School and the cost of Hedge trimming had been offset by this receipt.

Casual Vacancy. Owing to Mr. Willett resignation a Casual Vacancy had occured but after several attempts to fill the vacancy met with no success it was agreed to leave the vacancy until the elections in May.

Many other minor matters had been dealt with by the Council.
